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The Air of Eretz **Yisrael Makes One Wise**

There are many benefits to living in Eretz Yisrael, many of which we know of, and many of which we don't know of. Although we may have heard of some of them, we don't understand exactly what they mean. The Gemara in Bava Basra¹ mentions that "the air of Eretz Yisrael makes one wise." How can this be? The following article will discuss how, exactly, one is affected by the air of Eretz Yisrael.

Reasons for Wisdom

The Sforno² mentions that since Eretz Yisrael was not included in the destruction of the mabul, the air in Eretz Yisrael makes one wise.

The Radak³ says that this is a natural occurrence of the land of Eretz Yisrael.

It is reported in the name of the Maharsha that Moshe Rabbeinu looked at Eretz Yisrael from afar,4 and because of that he imbued the Land with wisdom.5

The Ha'emek Davar⁶ mentions that the *kedushah* of Eretz Yisrael is what makes one wise.

The Chida mentions that in Eretz Yisrael one's *tefillos* go straight to Hashem, and the same applies to Torah learning.⁷ The Mabit⁸ mentions that Eretz Yisrael is where Hashem is found more than any other place in the world, and therefore, this makes one wise.

Torah or All Wisdoms

Some mention that Eretz Yisrael has the ability to make one wise because its air is only for Torah and not secular subjects.⁹

Living or Visiting?

There is a discussion in the *poskim* if one needs to live in Eretz Yisrael in order for one to become wise or if a visit suffices.

According to the majority of *poskim*, even if one just visits, he becomes wise — although only slightly.¹⁰

Which Parts of Eretz Yisrael?

The opinion of Harav Chaim Kanievsky, *shlita*,¹¹ is that the Old City of Yerushalayim has the ability to make one wise, as compared to other places in Yerushalayim and Eretz Yisrael.

According to this, when looking for a yeshivah to learn in when in Eretz Yisrael, it may make sense to choose a

yeshivah in Yerushalayim or the Old City. However, the custom is that this is not a criterion when it comes to choosing a place to learn.12

After the Destruction of the Beis Hamikdash

Some mention that after the destruction of the Beis Hamikdash, the air of Eretz Yisrael no longer makes one wise.13

Bayli vs. Yerushalmi

Since the land of Eretz Yisrael makes one wise, if there is a dispute between the Talmud Bavli and Yerushalmi shouldn't we hold like the Talmud Yerushalmi? Why is this not the case? Perhaps because the Talmud Bavil came later we pasken like the latter opinion.14

Learning Alone

The Gemara in Taanis¹⁵ says that one should not learn alone. This concept is brought in halachah as well. 16 Often in yeshivas one can see people learning without a chavrusa. How is this possible if it is against halachah? Some say the halachah only applied when there were no sefarim or commentaries to help one understand the Gemara. However, since today there are many sefarim and commentaries to help one understand the Gemara, there is nothing wrong with learning alone.¹⁷ One who will learn better without a

chavrusa is permitted to learn alone.¹⁸ In Eretz Yisrael one can learn alone according to all opinions because the air of Eretz Yisrael makes a person wise.¹⁹

It is reported that although Harav Elyashiv, *zt"l*, learned alone his entire life, he did not want others to follow him in this regard.²⁰

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
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
